In one sentence, describe your job.

Stage managers ensure that the cast, artistic team, and all departments have the support and information required to tell the story as best as they can, and once the show opens, they maintain the integrity of the director's vision.

What skills are necessary for a person in your position?

A stage manager is a person who understands how details create the bigger picture; they need to be able to communicate, anticipate, and organize in order to support the other artists in the production and maintain the director's vision throughout the rehearsal and performance processes.

What is your background in the performing arts?

I started doing theatre as a high school junior and knew instantly that I wanted to continue my studies in college, but I wasn't sure what department I wanted to work in when I applied, so I went to a smaller school that taught me a little bit of everything. I quickly fell in love with stage management and have worked all over the country since graduating from college - learning a lot along the way. I'm very excited to continue that education in the next couple of months!
